Both Aer Lingus and Ryanair fly to Berlin's Schonefeld Airport.

Aer Lingus fly as follows:

Out: 10th Feb EI 332 Departing Dublin 11.45 arriving Berlin 14.55 Return 15th Feb EI 333 Departing Berlin 15.30 arriving Dublin 16.50

Ryanair's flight to Berlin leaves earlier at 9.50 am so arrives in Berlin at 12.55.

We have tickets booked with the Opera House at the top price of  $\in 86$  ( $\in 72$  for Dutchman) and the next price level of  $\in 69$  ( $\in 54$  for Dutchman). We have at present 26 tickets for each night. We will try to get more tickets or cheaper tickets if members would like them. It should be noted that as this is a modern house there are good sightlines from most seats even the cheaper ones.

Please revert to <u>ritaandanthony@eircom.net</u> if you would like to come. Members should book their own flights. We are in the process of organising a special rate at a hotel near the opera, and will let members know when this has been arranged, so that they can make their own reservations.

### **BAYREUTH BALLOT**

It is hoped to receive an allocation of tickets for the Ring and the other operas, (Meistersinger, Parsifal and Lohengrin) this year. Successful applicants may choose to take one, two, or three tickets for the three individual operas, but Ring tickets will be allocated as a complete Cycle.

## Reminder – New Rules for this year's Ballot for Bayreuth tickets for 2010

The July Newsletter outlined and explained the new rules which have been adopted for December's Bayreuth Ballot. The Newsletter is available on the Society's website, <a href="https://www.wagnersociety.ie">www.wagnersociety.ie</a>.

One of the most important changes has been that all applicants for, and recipients of, Bayreuth tickets must be members in good standing of the Wagner Society.

The first two tickets drawn will be reserved for members who have not previously been to Bayreuth with the Society. Successful applicants can choose either Ring tickets or tickets for other operas. In the first instance, names will be drawn from a bowl containing only the names of members who have not previously been to Bayreuth with the Society. After these first two members have been allocated tickets, the other applicants' names will be added to the bowl for the remaining rounds of the ballot.

Members cannot apply for any Society tickets for 2010 if they were allocated tickets for the 2009 Bayreuth Festspiele by the Society.

Members cannot apply for tickets from the Society for any production they attended heretofore with the Society.

After these rules have operated for a period, they will be reviewed and may be modified.

An application form is attached at the end of this Newsletter. Please ensure this reaches our Chairman, Anthony Linehan, by 1<sup>st</sup> December 2009.
